A RESOLUTION REQUESTING SERVICES FROM THE SALEM COUNTY MOSQUITO CONTROL

WHEREAS, the Township of Lower Alloways Creek contains several streams, creeks and ditches which have become a breeding ground for mosquitoes, including, but not limited to, the ditches located between New Bridge Road and Beasley Neck Road, and;

WHEREAS, the mosquito problem would be drastically improved if the built up debris were removed from the streams, creeks and ditches so as to allow for the free flow of water and reduce the existence of stagnant water, and;

WHEREAS, the Salem County Mosquito Control has the necessary resources to remove the trash and debris from the streams, creeks and ditches so as to allow for increased water flow.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Lower Alloways Creek that a request is hereby made that the Salem County Mosquito Control take all the necessary steps to assist the Township of Lower Alloways Creek by removing the built up debris from the streams, creeks and ditches, including, but not limited to, the ditches located between New Bridge Road and Beasley Neck Road in the areas indicated on the provided maps and drawings, so as to allow for the free flow of water and to decrease the existence of stagnant water.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk certify a copy of this resolution and file it on the public record.

Mrs. Pompper asked on whose behalf was this request being made. Mayor Bradway stated that the Tice's had asked that this request be made to the County and that this resolution and maps are what the County now wants for each individual request for ditching work to be done. Mayor Bradway commented that there is no guarantee that the County will do any of this work, as the County Mosquito Department does not have much staff or budget.

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A.40A:4-78b has authorized the Local Finance Board to adopt rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume the responsibility, normally granted to the Director of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination, and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1997, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 through 7.5 the Township of Lower Alloways Creek has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local Government Services and the Chief Financial Officer has determined that the municipality meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2015 budget year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Lower Alloways Creek, County of Salem that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & b, and based upon the Chief Financial Officer’s certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:
 - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges.
 - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures.
 - c. Cash deficit of preceding year.
 - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes.
 - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items.
 - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes.
2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at 40A:4-45.3 et. seq. are fully met.(Complies with "CAP" law.)
3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
 - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate, and stated.
 - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth.
 - c. In itemization, form, arrangement, and content, the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.
5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced, publicly advertised, and in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet deadlines of N.J.S.A.40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services upon adoption.

ORDINANCE 2015-03

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CAPITAL BUDGET OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LOWER ALLOWAYS CREEK AND AUTHORIZING CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$100,000.00

FOR THE PURPOSE OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND PUBLIC WORKS EQUIPMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS TO MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE, Township Committee of the Township of Lower Alloways Creek (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring) as follows:

Section 1. **\$100,000.00** is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund for the purpose of Public Safety and Public Works Equipment and Improvements to Municipal Buildings and Grounds.

Section 2. The Capital budget of the Township of Lower Alloways Creek is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistencies herewith. Detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services shall be on file with the Clerk and available there for public inspection.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect as provided by the law.

Public Hearing on this Ordinance shall be on Tuesday April 21, 2015, 2014 at 7:30 p.m., at the Municipal Building, 501 Locust Island Road, Hancock’s Bridge, New Jersey.

This Ordinance which was introduced for First Reading on March 17, 2015 shall be published by Title in the South Jersey Times and placed on the Township’s Bulletin Board and official website giving notice of said Public Hearing as required by Law.

Mayor Bradway asked if Mr. Sowers had any comments on this item. Mr. Sowers responded that the State provided the Township a digital finger print machine and provided maintenance on the machine for one year and now the Township has the responsibility to pay for the maintenance agreement.

Street Light - Hell Neck Road Mayor Bradway asked Mr. Venable about the Street Light agenda item. Mr. Venable stated that a resident had asked him if it would be possible for the Township to place a light near the end of his driveway on Hell Neck Road because he has children who wait for the school bus in the dark. Mr. Venable stated that he inquired and was told by the Clerk that there is a long standing policy that the Township Committee required there to be three homes in a grouping where a street light might be located. There are not three homes in a group in that area so he will tell the resident that no light will be located there.

Cell Phones Mayor Bradway asked Mr. Venable about the Cell Phone agenda item. Mr. Venable stated that he was aware that new cell phones were to be provided to the Police Department and Mr. Venable had concerns about how many cell phones were to be provided and was also concerned about the Township providing phones after the memo received from our labor counsel regarding cell phones.

Ball Fields Mr. Breslin stated that he was aware that work had been done on the Ball Fields here at the Municipal Complex by an outside agency. Mr. Breslin expressed concern that the Committee had not authorized any work to be done to the fields. Mr. Venable and the Mayor stated that there had been concerns about the Salem Little League changing the one field from a softball field to a hard ball little league field, but that was not what was done. Only new infield dirt and newer bases were installed. Mr. Breslin expressed his concern that someone other than Township employees or someone not authorized by the Township was doing work on the Township’s property and that we could be held liable, for them as they were making these changes and for the equipment that they had or did install. Mr. Venable stated that some of the Committee was aware, that these improvements were being made and that the fields use was not changed, just some infield dirt and new bases. Mrs. Chetney stated that because this area was for the “publics use” there was not any further liability, because the Salem Little League was using the fields.

Mrs. Chetney stated that there does not need to be an agreement with the league, but general rules for the fields use should be used.

Public Works: Mr. Lynch asked if the Committee had any questions on his Monthly report to the Committee, if not he would report that repairs are to be made to the Buckhorn Bridge beginning on or about May 20th. Mayor Bradway asked what length of time the Public Works Department would be looking at to employ Summer Workers. Mr. Lynch replied that they were looking at May 4th through October 16th.

Public Safety: Mr. Sowers stated that the County Prosecutor’s Office would be purchasing body cameras for the Counties Police Departments.

Fire Department: Chief Hinchman asked the Committee to consider making a designated LZ (helicopter landing zone) at the Canton Fire House. A recent need for a clear LZ that met the requirements of the medivac pilots has brought this need to the fore front. The Canton Fire House site has plenty of space and a clear area to have a helipad, which medivac pilots could then have a site map for, showing all the obstructions and elevations they need to know.

Mr. Venable thanked Kevin Underwood for his help with getting the Tanker repaired.

Mayor Bradway, Mr. Breslin, Mr. Palombo and Mrs. Pompper had no further comments.
