The L.A.C. Police Department is requesting the support of our residents. The Neighborhood Crime Watch is a group of organized citizens devoted to crime and vandalism prevention within a neighborhood. Anyone interested in participating is urged to contact the Police Department (935-7301). Ptl. Mike DeParre will gladly discuss and assist with this project. Participants will hopefully establish a network and be asked to “observe and report” suspicious activities. The Police Department is also establishing a Citizens Forum time when local residents can meet with a Police Supervisor or Administrator informally to ask questions, voice concerns, or just discuss police related issues. The first Forum will be on January 15, at 6:00 PM. Residents are encouraged to come to the Court Room at the LAC Municipal Building and discuss your concerns.

Mayor’s Memo

Several committee members have received complaints about the service, or lack thereof, provided by Verizon in the township. Many residents have no service when it rains, and by the time Verizon responds, it is working again. There is very little the committee can do about this, but we have added to the township website a complaint form link to the BPU that can be filled out and submitted electronically. We urge you to use this form to lodge complaints about any utility operating in the township. Several municipalities in Cumberland County have recently been successful in getting a commitment from Verizon to replace the antiquated copper lines with new fiber optic lines. They were successful by partnering with their State Assemblymen and Senator to lodge their complaints. We urge you also to contact our representatives each time you lodge a complaint with the BPU.

Assemblywoman Celeste Riley’s Office has been kind enough to have a meeting setup between members of the Township Committee, a representative of Verizon and a representative of NJ BPU to discuss the Phone land line situation in LAC. One thing that we have come to understand is, that the land line phone system must be available and working a certain percentage of the time under the Telephone Franchise Act. The way the phone land line service is measured for availability and quality seems to be by the number of complaints to the NJ BPU, this is why residents are encouraged to fill out the form on the NJ BPU website and submit it them each time they are experiencing problems in their service. The Township’s website has a link to this form and resident are encouraged to fill out the form every time they have problems with their phone service.
