Mayor's Memo

Hello Everyone,

The fall season is upon us. Remember to change the batteries in your smoke alarms and drive a little bit slower after dark, as the deer are on the move. The township committee recently learned that the lease we signed over a year ago with a company to develop a couple of cellular tower locations within the township has lapsed. The company did not exercise its option to renew at the one year point. This provides us with an opportunity to drop back and attempt a more comprehensive approach to the problems.

We suffer from both poor cellular service and poor land line service. This is similar to what Stow Creek and Greenwich townships faced a couple years ago. They have been successful in getting Verizon to begin replacing land lines, and Verizon has constructed at least one cell tower in their townships. Our engineers and attorneys have been tasked with learning from the Stow Creek and Greenwich examples and developing a plan of action for us to use. We set three goals. First, obviously, is to get Verizon to provide the service we are already paying for with our land lines. Second, is improving cellular coverage within the township. And third, expanding the service area with Comcast for cable is also important. We will keep you informed as these plans develop.

Also, the township newsletter may soon take on a new format. The Postal Service offers a carrier bulk rate for 8 1/2 by 11 items, unfolded, for about half what we are paying for this larger paper. We are investigating if this will meet our needs.


