The Committee discussed the engineer's report regarding Alloways Creek Neck Road Phase VI and that according to the report additional funds beyond that which was approved by the NJDOT (\$156,382.00) to complete areas that need resurfacing are needed, the engineer estimates it would take \$325,137.50 to complete everything up to newer paved areas. Some of the discussion focused on the fact that the areas in question were County roads and they should be responsible. The County will be contacted to see if they are willing to fund what would be their portion of any work. The Committee did agree that the Township only do as much work as the NJDOT funding in Phase VI covers.

War Monument – adding names

The Committee discussed receiving applications and Mr. Bradway and Mr. Palombo volunteered to be a review committee to look at the applications to see if they qualify.

Police Department:

Chief Venable spoke with the Committee about how the Department now had no Part-Time Officers as one was call to active status in the National Guard to help with the pandemic and the other one also works in hospital security and therefore has not been used. Chief Venable stated that this means we either pay the officers for the full 84 hour shift or pay them over time to prevent doing so. The consensus of the Committee was that it was acceptable to pay for the full 84 hours.

Public Works:

Superintendent Fogg asked if there were any questions regarding his monthly report. Superintendent Fogg spoke to the Committee about the flower beds at the Municipal Building. There was some discussion about an aluminum flag pole taken from the Public Works yard during recycling hours.

Mayor and Committee Members

Mr. Venable and Mr. Bradway commented for everyone to stay safe.

Mayor Pompper spoke with the rest of the Committee about what might need to be in the newsletter regarding no Log Cabin in May and other items.

Mayor Pompper stated that in speaking with PSEG Officials there will be no May Drill because of the pandemic and that they have taken precautions to ensure they have a virus free workforce.

PUBLIC COMMENT: No one from the Public indicated that they wished to make any comments.
