RESOLUTION 2020-49

A Resolution Amending the Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual

WHEREAS, it is the policy of Township of Lower Alloways Creek to treat employees and prospective employees in a manner consistent with all applicable employment laws and regulations including, but not limited to Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended by the Equal Opportunity Act of 1972, the Age Discrimination in Employment Act, the Equal Pay for Equal Work Act, the Fair Labor Standards Act, the New Jersey Law Against Discrimination, the Americans with Disabilities Act, the Family and Medical Leave Act, the Conscientious

Employee Protection Act, the Public Employee Occupational Safety and Health Act, (the New Jersey Civil Service Act,) (the New Jersey Attorney General's guidelines with respect to Police Department personnel matters,) the New Jersey Workers Compensation Act, the Federal Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (COBRA) and the Open Public Meeting Act; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Lower Alloways Creek has determined that there is a need for personnel policies and procedures to ensure that employees and prospective employees are treated in a manner consistent with these laws and regulations.

NOW, THEREBY, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Lower Alloways Creek that the Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual is hereby amended in the following Sections to conform to current State laws:

Sick Leave Policy – Changes to be consistent with Current New Jersey Law

Family and Medical Leave Policy - Changes to be consistent with Current New Jersey Law

Domestic Violence Leave – Changes to be consistent with Current New Jersey Law

Equal Opportunity Policy – added the word "Compensation"

Protection and Safe Treatment of Minors – New Section

Policy Against Harassment in the Workplace, becomes, Policy Prohibiting Harassment in the Workplace - Change Solicitor information

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these personnel policies and procedures shall apply to all Township officials, appointees, employees, volunteers and independent contractors. In the event there is a conflict between these rules and any collective bargaining agreement, personnel services contract or Federal or State law, the terms and conditions of that contract or law shall prevail. In all other cases, these policies and procedures shall prevail.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this manual is intended to provide guidelines covering public service by Township employees and is not a contract. The provisions of this manual may be amended and supplemented from time to time without notice and at the sole discretion of the Township Committee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that to the maximum extent permitted by law, employment practices for the Township shall operate under the legal doctrine known as "employment at will."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Township Committee and all managerial/supervisory personnel are responsible for these employment practices. All managerial/supervisory personnel shall assist the Township Committee in the implementation of the policies and procedures in this manual.

Public Works:

Superintendent Lewis Fogg spoke with the Committee about a home at Leisure Arms that the tenants are complaining that mold is in the home. Superintendent Lewis Fogg stated he contacted the Township's HVAC contractor and after inspecting the system and conditions, he concurred with the diagnosis that the substance that was on filters and ductwork surfaces was nicotine residue.

Superintendent Lewis Fogg stated that there is a problem with the ballfield lights and he will need to have them looked at, there is a possible shorted ballast which is causing the main breaker to trip and when that happens the LED sign out front loses power also.

Superintendent Lewis Fogg spoke with the Committee about the progress or lack thereof at the intersection of Main Street Canton and Friendship Road (Curbing).

The Public Works Department was going to replace the curbing for the County, when it was informed by the County that a "Drop Down" for handicapped access was required at that location, but it was our responsibility.

A resident at that location complained because he believed the "Drop Down" was and would be the cause of trucks running over his lawn and wants a full height curbing to stop trucks from running over his lawn.

Police Department:

Chief Venable stated that a Part-Time Officer that he thought might be seeking employment with LAC, is instead seeking employment with the State Police.

Chief Venable stated that the Committee had approved the Department getting a new Server and computer equipment at budget time and now that the Department has switch Computer Maintenance Providers, he is now going to get a quote from them for the equipment and will be ready with a proposal in September.

Fire Department: no report

Mayor and Committee Members

Mayor Pompper stated that the Log Cabin will be open on September 20th, since everything mostly takes place outdoors, she sees no problem with starting the scheduled openings this fall.

Any matter falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.
