### REPORTS TO THE COMMITTEE & COMMITTEE REPORTS:

### **Public Works:**

Superintendent Lewis Fogg spoke with the Committee about Opening the Playground to the public, again requiring bulk stickers to discard trash at the convenience center (starting Aug 1<sup>st</sup>), that one of the recycling trucks water pump failed while on its route was repaired and curbing is to be done at the intersection of Main Street Canton & Friendship Road and a twenty foot section along the school's driveway.

Mr. Venable ask the superintendent about when Maskells Mill Road being paved. Superintendent Lewis Fogg as far as he knows it is on the Counties schedule to be done.

### **Police Department:**

Chief Venable stated that a Police Vehicle had an incident and was fixed by the Public Works maintenance shop.

Chief Venable stated that the full time officer on deployment will be back in August.

Chief Venable stated that he would like to bring up with the Committee next Month about hiring a full time office and a part time officer to bring the part time officer total to three to relieve the over time.

Mayor Pompper asked the Chief to explain to the Committee Kelley Time.

Chief Venable stated that the officer's schedule comes out to 84 hours in a two week period, they are normally paid for 80 hours and the 4 extra hours they are given off. How that has worked is every month a part time officer would work 8 of the full time officer's scheduled hours (4 hours from each two week period) and no overtime would need to be paid. Since we are down a full time officer to deployment and the two part time officers, we have been paying overtime to the full time officers, because we had no choice.

# **Fire Department:**

Chief Fisher stated that the department is back to doing training.

Chief Fisher stated that there have been two fires this past month one in Alloway (A hay barn) and one in Pilesgrove (egg farm). Chief Fisher stated that as the Committee is aware there were two incidents related to the Fire yesterday, a truck accident and one person had heat exhaustion at the fire.

# **Mayor and Committee Members**

Mayor Pompper stated that the State Economic Development Office wants to come a meet with the Committee about the Wind Port in the coming months to discuss and answer any questions we have about it.

### **PUBLIC COMMENT:**

Mr. Hunter a representative for the co-ed softball league wanted to know if they would be able to use the ball field this fall and if so under what conditions. Mayor Pompper stated that the Governor had opened things for outside sports and she feels that probably our insurance company and Emergency Management Officer would have the best information as to what is suggested as the best way to proceed.

# **RESOLUTION 2020 - 47**A RESOLUTION FOR A CLOSED SESSION

Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.
- \_\_\_\_\_ 7. Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation other than in (4) above in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matter falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.
- 8. Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.

More specifically, the matter to be discussed involves the following:

1. Potential Litigation

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the matters discussed will be available for public inspection

1. At such time the matter is concluded

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Closed Session is expected to continue for ten (10) minutes and there after the regular meeting would then reconvene and further business by the Committee would not take place at its conclusion.
