ORDINANCE 2022-04

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CAPITAL BUDGET OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LOWER ALLOWAYS CREEK AND AUTHORIZING CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$100,000.00) FOR THE PURPOSES OF ENGINEERING AND RELATED COSTS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A BROADBAND AND CELLULAR COMMUNICATIONS TOWER

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE, Township Committee of the Township of Lower Alloways Creek (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring) as follows:

Section 1. That One Hundred thousand dollars (\$ 100,000.00) is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement General Fund for the purpose of engineering and related costs for the construction of a broadband and cellular communications tower.

Section 2. The Capital budget of the Township of Lower Alloways Creek is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistencies herewith. Detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services shall be on file with the Clerk and available there for public inspection.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect as provided by the law.

Public Hearing on this Ordinance shall be on Tuesday July 19, 2022 at 7:30 p.m., at the Municipal Building, 501 Locust Island Road, Hancock's Bridge, New Jersey.

This Ordinance which was introduced for First Reading on June 21, 2022 and shall be published by Title in the South Jersey Times and placed on the Township's Bulletin Board giving notice of said Public Hearing as required by Law.

CORRESPONDENCE:

Mayor Bradway asked the Committee if they had any comments on a letter received from the State Agricultural Development Committee regarding farmland preservation of three parcels in the township and if LAC had any requests for easements on these lands. The Township Committee had no specific recommendations but asked that the Superintendent of Public works, Lewis Fogg look them over for any drainage ditches that may need easements.

All other correspondence received has been distributed to the proper parties

REPORTS TO THE COMMITTEE & COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Police Department:

Police Chief Venable stated that the National Night Out is coming up Tuesday August 2, 2022 6 -9 PM and lots of things will be going on that night.

Police Chief Venable stated that the new police car struck a deer recently and the department is hoping to get the repairs completed prior to the Night Out, a preliminary estimate is \$3,400.00.

Motion (Collier, Crane) to repair the police vehicle #184 which hit a deer at a cost not to exceed four thousand dollars (\$ 4,000.00).

Public Works:

Superintendent Fogg stated that the Log cabin Refinishing Project is finished and that Mr. Hill and Mr. Mitchell did an excellent job of replacing damaged trim pieces.

Superintendent Fogg stated that the County Public Works Department had informed him that they do not have enough equipment or workers to mow County roadsides in LAC. Superintendent Fogg stated that our road department could do these areas and have were necessary for sight line issues and for issues with tree limbs in the way of trash trucks. The Committee discussed mowing the county roadsides and sending the county a bill for the hours and diesel used.

Fire Department:

Chief Fisher stated he is still waiting for the different LAC departments to get together to consider what may be required with the rise in sea levels, he feels we need to get ahead of it before it's a problem.

Chief Fisher stated that he also wants to get with the Wind Port people to make them aware of what would be needed in case of an emergency there, with regard to the kind of equipment that they are using at the site and what the cost of lifting bags or other equipment specific to their site might be.

Mayor and Committee Members

Mr. Collier thought it was a good idea to have drills with the people at the port. Mr. Collier commented that he has heard of some problems that the Zoning Officer and Construction office has had with residents not complying and he would like to see them report such issue along with their monthly reports.

Mrs. Crane stated that the next open house for the Log Cabin is Sunday September 18th. Mrs. Crane stated that there are new people (Superintendent & Business Administrator) running LAC School and perhaps someone from the Committee should attend their meetings to get to know those faces, the Committee was fine with Mrs. Crane doing so.

Mayor Bradway stated that at the Planning Zoning Board Meeting last month there was concern about making the Canton Fire House property Commercial and what it would mean for the neighboring area in noise and traffic. Mayor Bradway stated that is was scheduled to be further discussed at the next meeting, which is next Wednesday.

Mayor Bradway stated that at a recent meeting with the Wind Port, they reported that:

- they had purchased 110 acres from PSEG (parcel),
- dredging is to begin near the port area in early August,
- their workforce is down slightly to about 50 persons,
- they are ok with holding emergency drill once a quarter,
- even with the bridge restrictions they are receiving piles at a normal rate as expected,
- they still have to look into if New Bridge is under the State Historic Society.

Mayor Bradway stated that a representative from Verizon will be coming on Thursday the 21st to go over sites for a cell tower.

Mayor Bradway stated when asked, that the ambulance services are going well and that the local squad had been on two calls.

PUBLIC COMMENT: No one from the Public indicated that they wished to make any comments.

<u>3.</u> Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.

6. Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations or possible violations of the law.

7. Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation other than in (4) above in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matter falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.

8. Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.

More specifically, the matter to be discussed involves the following:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.
