A RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT BUDGET CAP RELIEF

Whereas, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45, et al, a municipality is required to limit any increase in is levy to 2.0% and any increase in appropriations to 2 ½% or the cost-of-living adjustment, whatever is less over the final appropriations subject to certain exceptions; and

Whereas, all local public entities have incurred an estimated \$ 50 million in Covid Related worker's compensation clams and that these costs will continue to increase as a result of long term COVID cases; and WHEREAS, a 2021 New Jersey Department of Labor decision regarding workers compensation funding has generated increase costs to municipalities by over 10% in order to cover claims that were previously funded by the state pension system; and,

Whereas, a recent amendment to the sexual molestation limitations will increase the

WHEREAS, the frequency of weather-related catastrophic claims and corresponding impacts are anticipated to increase property costs by way over 10% per year; and

WHEREAS, cyber liability evens throughout the country have resulted in doubling premium costs in 2023 and such costs are expected to accelerate at a pace far greater than the rate of inflation

WHEREAS, these increasing costs, regulations, policy decisions and environmental impacts are occurring when many other items and costs in municipal budgets are also in at an inflationary rate increasing.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Township of Lower Alloways Creek that N.J.S.A. 40A-4-45, et al be amended to provide that appropriations in the first three years after the effective date of (this amendment) for liability insurance , worker's compensation insurance, cyber insurance, and property insurance be exempt from the Appropriation CAP and the Levy CAP.

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Lower Alloways Creek has determined that it is in its best interest to enter into an agreement (the "Agreement") with the Carneys Point Township for the provision of Primary Emergency Medical Service Basic Life Support (ambulance) coverage.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED by the of the Township Committee of the Township of Lower Alloways Creek, in the County of Salem, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute an Agreement with the Township of Carneys Point for Primary Emergency Medical Service Basic Life Support (ambulance) coverage in the form attached hereto for the period of July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2024, subject to any contract extension that may be approved by the Township Committee with Carneys Point Township.

CORRESPONDENCE:

The Clerk related that someone representing Verizon Cell Tower site acquisitions contacted the Township about placing cell phone antennas on a tower specifically in Hancocks Bridge. This representative will be making a visit here shortly. Mayor Bradway stated that since the Township has been wanting a cell tower to come to LAC and we have definite interest, it was thought that we should appropriate funds to get things moving with engineering and related upfront costs.

ORDINANCE INTRODUCTION

ORDINANCE 2022-04

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CAPITAL BUDGET OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LOWER ALLOWAYS CREEK AND AUTHORIZING CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$100,000.00) FOR THE PURPOSES OF ENGINEERING AND RELATED COSTS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A BROADBAND AND CELLULAR COMMUNICATIONS TOWER

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE, Township Committee of the Township of Lower Alloways Creek (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring) as follows:

Section 1. That One Hundred thousand dollars (\$ 100,000.00) is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement General Fund for the purpose of engineering and related costs for the construction of a broadband and cellular communications tower.

Section 2. The Capital budget of the Township of Lower Alloways Creek is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistencies herewith. Detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services shall be on file with the Clerk and available there for public inspection.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect as provided by the law.

Public Hearing on this Ordinance shall be on Tuesday July 19, 2022 at 7:30 p.m., at the Municipal Building, 501 Locust Island Road, Hancock's Bridge, New Jersey.

This Ordinance which was introduced for First Reading on June 21, 2022 and shall be published by Title in the South Jersey Times and placed on the Township's Bulletin Board giving notice of said Public Hearing as required by Law.

REPORTS TO THE COMMITTEE & COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Police Department:

Chief Venable stated that the State Police had come and taken the Alcohol machine for their use as approved by the Committee last month.

Fire Department:

Fire Chief Fisher stated that he had gone with the Mayor to the wind port to see what they had as far as emergency supplies and spoke with them about what they may want to get. Chief Fisher stated that they will be running three dredging operations shortly. Chief Fisher asked the Committee if it would be alright for the LAC Fire Truck to be in the Woodstown 4th Parade and the Mayor asked the Committee who indicated their consent.

Mayor and Committee Members

Mr. Collier stated that he had been asked by the owner of Creek's Edge Pizza if the Township, who does use their property for parking during National Night Out, could mow the grass around the pond. The Committee was alright with doing so, every two weeks.

Mrs. Crane stated that correspondence was received from the school thanking us for the LAC Historic Award which went to Kyla Henderson, as the most improved 8th grade student in the subject history, this award is sponsored by the LAC Historical Society.

Mayor Bradway stated that the NJLOM has started a campaign to get the legislature to use the current year's State surplus to fully fund the Energy Receipts to municipalities, this includes Mayor's signing a petition and asking each municipality to do a resolution making such a request of the State. Mayor Bradway stated that it has been decades since the State has taken funds away from the municipalities and not fully funded the Energy Receipts Tax. Apparently the State is going to have a surplus this year, making it a good time for them to do as promised years ago.

Mayor Bradway stated that in a meeting with the Wind Port officials, they stated that a cement plant will be coming to Oldmans Twp to make the pier pilings and they then will be transported by barge to the site. Mayor Bradway stated that he and the Fire Chief had a meeting with their emergency aid personnel to see what they have and they asked that we have emergency drills every so often for everyone to get familiar with the area and challenges they might see there. Mayor Bradway stated that they still are looking for a food truck to service the workers at the Wind Port.

PUBLIC COMMENT: No one from the Public indicated that they wished to make any comments.

ADJOURNMENT

Motion (Venable, Collier) to adjourn the meeting at 8:05 p.m.
